The art of Japanese flower arranging involves looking at flowers, leaves, and other materials from a perspective that provides tranquility and peace of mind. The arranger uses his or her aesthetic awareness to assemble materials in order to endow them with beauty which transcends their appearance in nature -- and pleases the viewer's aesthetic senses.

Our presenter, Karen Kirk, earned the highest teaching rank in Sogetsu Ikebana, Riji, in 2018 after undertaking rigorous examinations. There are only two other sensei (teachers) in Hawai'i who have attained this prestigious rank. She has exhibited in major ikebana installations in multiple local venues including the Honolulu Museum of Art, the Blaisdell Arena, Honolulu Hale, and the Japanese Consulate.



Sensei Karen will give an overview of ikebana including its origins and the basic elements of any ikebana arrangement. She will demonstrate the construction of an arrangement and then allow participants to create their own mini arrangement to take home.

There will be a \$4.00 kit fee to cover the cost of materials.

Bring:

Plant clippers, kitchen shears, or “junk” scissors. Optional: bowl or dishpan to hold water. Please plan ahead by thinking about how you will transport your newly created arrangement home by bringing a small bucket or box—it might fit in your car's drink holder but it might be hard to lift out.
